# Configuration

- The C-Bus 40 series master module is a C-Bus key input device that is assigned a unique unit address on the network.
- Maximum configuration is 1 master module and 3 slave modules. Minimum configuration is a master module.
- The C-Bus 40 series master module is a control switch only which is never directly connected to power. The C-Bus network uses unshielded twisted pair Cat 5e, 4-Pair. The C-Bus network powers the master module. Both master and slave modules have LED indicators. Slave modules are powered from the master module.
- Optional slave modules have a ribbon cable with a female connector that attaches to a socket in the master module.
- C-Bus Toolkit software is used to program the master module and its associated slave modules. Using software not provided by Clipsal may void any warranties applicable to the hardware.

# බ් C-Bus Requirements

## Programming

Create relationships between input and output units without a PC using learn mode: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=8oN3KGNgIsw</u>, to link multiple units into a common network. Assign a load like a light on a dimmer with a controller (wall switch). Basic settings created in learn mode may need to be overridden to create a particular effect, using the latest C-Bus Toolkit software available from <u>www.clipsal.com/trade/</u> support/software.

## C-Bus Power

C-Bus master modules draw 18 mA from the C-Bus network, regardless of the number of slaves connected. Adequate C-Bus power supply modules must be installed to support connected devices. The network window of a C-Bus Toolkit project provides a summary of a C-Bus network according to the modules added.

# Installation


## Mounting in the Iconic grid plate

C-Bus 40 series modules can only be used with Iconic grid plates.

## Master modules

- 2 and 3 gang plate: Install the master module in top position (1).
- 4 gang plate: Install master in top left 1.

Note: C-Bus fly-lead cable  $(\underline{3})$  must be plugged to the right  $(\underline{2})$  in 2 and 3 gang plates, and to the top in 4 gang plates.




4 gang (rear view)


## Slave modules

On 4 gang grid plates install the slave module to match key numbering in programming:

- K2 in top right
- · K3 in bottom left, and
- K4 in bottom right





Note: Be careful of cables and screw fixings when mounting in wall boxes.



## Connecting slave to master and to C-Bus

- ① Attach up to 3 slave modules to the master using the ribbon cable. When removing a connector from the module, pull carefully on the ribbon to remove.
- (2) Use the supplied pink Plug-in C-Bus Fly Lead Terminal to connect the master module to the C-Bus Cat 5e UTP cable.
- ③ Use C-Bus Cat 5e UTP cable (solid or stranded) and connect C-Bus positive (blue + orange) to the terminal marked +, and C-Bus negative (blue/white + orange/white to the terminal marked -.










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
### Fitting and removing the module to the grid plate

- ① Move the locking bar to the open position. Note: On 3-gang plates, the locking bar is a single piece covering all cut-outs.
- 2 Push the head of the module into the plate cut-out until the module clicks into place.
- ③ Once the module is installed in the plate (or all modules if using multi-gang plates), move the locking bar to the closed position.



## Removing the module from the grid plate

- ① To remove, repeat step ① in Fitting and removing the module to grid plate (above).
- ② On the front of the grid plate gently press the green edges of the module to release, until it clicks out.




